 African-American students are expelled or suspended at triple the rate of their European-American peers. (2011-2012 Department of Ed)

 Discipline Rates: African-American students are more likely to be disciplined than European-American students. (Tsai, 2013)

- Ensuring all students' rights are respected and all students' needs are met.
- Enhancing their own cultural competence and facilitating the cultural awareness, knowledge and skills of all school personnel.

Cultural Competence and Ethics

Cultural Competency

 ASCA affirms that professional school counselors should "actively seek to expand their cultural competence and commitment to social justice advocacy, knowledge and skills."

Knowledge

Strive to gain knowledge and understanding about culture.

Attitudes

Develop a self awareness of beliefs, biases, and world-view.

Skills

• Demonstrate skills and competencies including advocacy, communication, and experiences with diverse groups.

Practically Addressing Cultural Competence

Cultural Competence and Ethics

Knowledge

- Students deconstructed race via...
 - Learning a national [and local] history of racism.
 - Challenging common (mis)conceptions.

Attitudes

- Students developed a more comprehensive awareness of...
 - Their personal beliefs regarding race and culture.
 - Their own biases as exhibited through stereotypes and actions.
 - Their personal world view.

Skills

- Students gained skills via...
 - Experiencing exposure to diverse groups.
 - Being actively anti-racist through the arts, skits, analyzing music, etc.


